# 1.1. South Queensland

The following report presents the results of the Rural Industries Job and Skill Research for the South Queensland region. Results are also provided for the top three industries in the region; Beef Combined (Intensive & Pastoral) (22%), Grain and Feed (19%) and Sheep (18%).

A summary of the key results for the South Queensland region is provided below.

- In the South Queensland region, just over half of businesses (52%) employ casual staff with an average of 8.8 casuals employed on an annual basis. Casuals generally perform manual / general labour (18%), harvesting (11%) and stockwork (11%).
- Almost six in ten businesses (57%) use contractors, and the most common roles performed by contractors include harvesting (21%), manual / general labour (14%) and spraying (10%).
- Approximately one quarter of businesses (27%) have employed new staff in the past 12 months, with 62% sourcing new staff through a contact / friend / family member (incl. word of mouth).
- In the South Queensland region 8% of businesses currently have employment vacancies.
- The most preferred methods for training staff members include field days (27%) and participating in workshops or classes (24%). However time commitment (20%), cost (19%) and accessibility (12%) are key impediments to training staff members.
